Topic: “Paul of Tarsus: Apostle and Evangelist” In this Jubilee Year of Saint Paul, Pope Benedict XVI invites and directs us “to learn from St. Paul, to learn faith, to learn Christ, and finally to learn the ways of upright living.” Paul never abandoned his Jewishness and treasured his heritage. Through an examination of his life and legacy, his apostolic witness of love and faith will be presented as “a paradigm of the highest order from whom we all, always, still have much to learn.” After Fr.
